PREFACE

THE National Institute of Public Finance and Policy had organised a National Seminar on "Savings Estimates in India—Recent Trends and Underlying Factors" in November 1988 at the instance of the Planning Commission. Eminent scholars working in the area from all over India were invited to contribute papers and attend. Prof. S. Chakravarty, Chairman, Research Advisory Committee of the Planning Commission inaugurated the Seminar.

While stagnation in the domestic savings ratio in recent years has been a matter for concern, a careful assessment of the trends and studies to identify the factors at work had not been undertaken. This was the motivation for the Seminar. The present volume is the outcome of that Seminar. Papers included in this volume go into several important aspects of the trends in domestic savings ratio and the factors underlying them.
